## **Findings of final sampling at Leaside Road Allotment**

Dear Allotment Holder,

The Council has completed the additional sampling of Leaside Road allotment. Six additional samples were collected and analysed for lead and arsenic, the contaminants of primary concern. The purpose of this additional sampling was to determine whether the two exceedences detected during the initial site investigation were outliers or indicated more widespread contamination.

In accordance with CLR 7, Assessment of risks to human health from land contamination: an overview of the development of guideline values and related research, published by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and the Environment Agency the results were statistically analysed to determine the potential risks to human health.

The results of the statistical analysis were 19mg/kg for arsenic and 294mg/kg for lead, which are below the Soil Guidance Values of 20mg/kg and 450mg/kg for arsenic and lead respectively. Therefore Leaside Road allotment does not pose a potential risk to human health.

Statistical analysis indicate that the two exceedences detected during the initial round of sampling were anomalies, and are not representative of the general site concentrations of lead and arsenic.

The Council is confident that the site does not pose a risk to human health and that the site can be continued to be used and enjoyed as an allotment.

As promised at the recent public meeting on this issue, I would like to repeat the Council's commitment to retaining and supporting allotments in the borough and to confirm that the Council has no other plans for any allotment sites.

I am sorry if the initial assessment of the potential risk on this allotment may have caused you concern, but the Council has a duty to take any potential risks to public health very seriously and to be as open and transparent as possible with residents of the borough.
