Due to the large waiting list should we change the neglected plot policy and reduce the time frame to 6 weeks and one warning letter, before a notice to quit is issued? Site reps will make all efforts to help plot-holders avoid eviction. Extenuating circumstances will always be taken into account.

not qualify for the group discount. I'll need to pay in full, which I'll do

on my credit card, and then you pay for your order with relevant discount on collection from me at 25 Listria Park N16 5SW. There's usually someone in after 6.30pm, or you could ring to confirm weekends or 9.30am-3pm on Mondays and Tuesdays.

Please let me know details of any order you would like to make by the end of October. I will either confirm I've sent it off and let you know when it arrives, or let you know the total is not enough to qualify for discount so more convenient for each of us to do separately.

September tasks on your allotment

- ♦ Sow fast maturing varieties of spring cabbage, turnip, spinach, winter lettuce, oriental vegetables and overwintering onion seed (both salad and bulb types).
- ♦ Plant overwintering onion sets and garlic bulbs in late September.
- Spring cabbages sown last month are probably ready for planting out. Cover with netting to stop the pigeons.
- ♦ Dig up potatoes before slug damage becomes a problem. Leave to dry for two to three hours before storing.
- ♦ Regularly pick fast maturing vegetables: French beans, runner beans, courgettes, cucumbers and tomatoes, to prevent them becoming tough and encourage further crops.
- \Diamond $\;$ Pick remaining outdoor tomatoes by the end of the month to ripen indoors.
- Aubergines may still be cropping in the greenhouse. Pick them once the fruits have coloured, but before the skins start to wrinkle.
- ♦ Lift onions and shallots once the foliage has started to die back. Do not be tempted to bend over the tops by hand as this can reduce storage time. Allow them to dry on the soil surface if weather permits, otherwise in a well-ventilated shed. Thick-necked onions should be used as they may rot.
- \diamond Harvest sweetcorn as it becomes ripe. Push a fingernail into the kernel as the tassels start to shrivel and brown. If the liquid is milky, they are ready.
- \Diamond $\;$ Harvest remaining globe artichokes now, before the buds start to open.
- ♦ Marrows, pumpkins and squashes may be ready for harvesting. Leave them in the sun, or in a greenhouse, to let the skins harden and dry off, before storing them in a cool, dry, dark place.
- ♦ When asparagus foliage turns brown, it is time to cut it down. Take care of the spines, and give the plants a good mulch afterwards.
- ♦ Earth up celery for the final time this month, leaving a tuft of foliage sticking out of the trench or collar to blanch the stems. Self-blanching types are less hardy, and should be harvested before the first frosts. Trench cultivars can be left in the ground.
- ♦ Irregular watering can lead to problems with blossom end rot on tomatoes, splits in root vegetables, pea and bean flowers aborting, checked growth on winter squash and pumpkins. Help prevent this by watering during dry spells.
- ♦ Sow green manures, such as mustard and Italian ryegrass, to prevent autumn weeds establishing and to act as a soil improver once dug in during winter or spring. Alternatively, place black plastic over bare ground after clearing old crops to suppress weed growth.
